

MANY COLLEGE NINES IDLE BECAUSE OF RAIN

St. John's-Vermont, Princeton- North Carolina Among Games Called Off.

Rain or wet grounds yesterday prevented the playing of a number of college baseball games scheduled for Eastern teams. Among those rained out was the St. John's College of Brooklyn-University of Vermont contest, scheduled to be played at Dexter Park. The game was canceled.

The Princeton and the University of Pennsylvania nines were idle for the second successive day because of adverse conditions. At Chapel Hill, N. C., wet grounds caused the cancellation of the first game in the two-game series between Princeton and the University of North Carolina. The second will be contested at Chapel Hill today, weather permitting.

The Penn nine was booked to oppose the Quantico Marines, at Quantico, Va. On Monday both Princeton and Penn were scheduled to play Duke University at Durham, N. C., in a double-header.

Another contest canceled because of rain was the meeting between Holy Cross and Temple, listed for Philadelphia.
