

PENN'S WRESTLERS DEFEAT COLUMBIA

**Win 5 of the 8 Bouts to Score
Triumph by 15 to 13 in
Lions' Gymnasium.**

The University of Pennsylvania wrestling team defeated Columbia, 15-13, yesterday, in the Lions' gymnasium in an Alumni Day meet.

The Red and Blue won five of the eight bouts, but it was the final event, between Hartwell Cross of Penn and Fred Davenport of Columbia, that gave the Philadelphians their victory. Cross puffed up a time advantage of 5:40 and apparently was headed for an easy victory, but Davenport displayed renewed vigor in the closing minutes and almost scored a fall.

Pete Kalajian, 135-pounder, and Ed King, 175-pound competitor, registered falls for Columbia. King's performance was especially impressive, as he tossed Aaron Basamajian in 5:22 with a head scissors and bar hold.

Brown scored the remainder of Columbia's points on a time advantage over Fry in the 145-pound bout.

Penn built up an early lead when Levine and Moore won by time advantages in the first two bouts.
