

LEHIGH WRESTLERS UPSET PENN, 31 TO 3

*Gain Twentieth Straight Dual
Meet Triumph, Winning
Five Bouts by Falls.*

PHILADELPHIA, March 3.—Lehigh University, Eastern intercollegiate wrestling champion for the last three years, gained its twentieth straight dual meet victory by subduing Pennsylvania in the Pa-lestra today, 31 to 3.

The Brown and White, fresh from its conquest of Cornell last night, gained five falls and two decisions.

Captain Benjamin Bishop, Lehigh 165-pounder, threw Walter Clark with a double arm lock in 6 minutes 55 seconds. Milo Miexell, Ramon Gonzales, Walter Crockett and Howell Scobey also scored falls.

Acting Captain Clay Lee competed in the 175-pound division for the first time and registered Penn's only victory, a decision over Stan Goodrich.
