

# PENN TOPS PRINCETON IN LEAGUE SOCCER, 1-0

## *Ends Middle Atlantic Schedule With Only One Defeat—Tiger Freshmen Triumph, 3-1.*

PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 23.—Pennsylvania closed its soccer season by defeating Princeton on River Field today, 1 to 0, and assured itself of at least second place in the Middle Atlantic Intercollegiate League. Cornell still tops the circuit.

The goal was scored by George Foust. He headed the ball into the net on a pass from Ramon Gonzalez sixteen minutes after the third quarter got under way.

The Red and Blue has won four and lost one in the league. Cornell has won four straight, but still has Haverford to play.

After the match, Charles Scott of Philadelphia was elected captain of Penn for next year.

The Princeton freshmen won from the Penn yearlings, 3 to 1. Davis kicked two goals.
