

NAVY MATMEN BEAT PENN.

Triumph, 38-0, Scoring on 7 Falls
and a Decision.

ANNAPOLIS, Md., Jan. 26.—Winning seven bouts on falls and the other on a decision, the Naval Academy wrestlers blanked the University of Pennsylvania team, 38 to 0, today.

Only Don Taylor, who escaped being thrown by Frank Wright in the 145-pound class, kept the navy's score from reaching the possible maximum. Wright won the decision with a time advantage of 1:39.
