

Navy Nine Downs Harvard, 12-10, Darkness Halting Game in Eighth

Mann, Making Debut With Middies, Cracks Homer First Time Up, Then Hits Single.—Princeton Tops Lafayette, 7-5, as Farber Shines in Relief—Penn and Duke Also Win

ANNAPOLIS, Md., April 7.—Navy scored its first baseball triumph of the young season today, conquering Harvard, 12-10, in a loosely played but exciting game. The contest went seven and a half innings and was called because of darkness after more than two and a half hours of play.

Harvard sent Eliot to the bench in the first inning after four runs had been scored on singles by Johns, Billodeau and McDrennen, Lupien's double and McGuinness's error. The Navy tied the count in the second and added three runs in the third, one in the fourth, three more in the fifth and one in the seventh.

Ralph Mann, playing his first game for the Middies, relieved Anderson in right field in the fifth and cracked out a homer to deep center, driving Matheson across the plate ahead of him, on his first effort with the stick. He made a beautiful single the next time up, scoring Matheson again.

The Navy made its quartet of tallies in the second on singles by Schroeder and Matheson, passes to Cooke and McGuinness, Bruckel's sacrifice and Lupien's misplay.

PRINCETON, N. J., April 7.—Princeton's rejuvenated nine continued its winning ways today and in a tight, fast-moving game turned back Lafayette, 7-5, for its third consecutive victory of the Spring vacation.

Remarkable relief hurling by Dawson Farber, sophomore left-hander, combined with the timely hitting of Rolf Paine, his senior battery-mate, were the big factors in the triumph.

Farber replaced Dick Bell in the third, extricated himself from his difficulties with the loss of a run, and then held the Pennsylvanians to three hits through the remaining six innings. Paine's home run in the third knotted the score at 5-5 and his scorching single in the fourth drove in the deciding tallies.
