ANNAPOLIS, Md., April 7.-Navy scored its first baseball triumph of the young season today, conquering Harvard, 12-10, in a loosely played but exciting game. The contest went seven and a half innings and was called because of darkness after more than two and a half hours of play.

Harvard sent Eliot to the bench in the first inning after four runs had been scored on singles by Johns, Billodeau and McDrennen, Lupien's double and McGuinness's error. The Navy tied the count in the second and added three runs in the third, one in the fourth, three more in the fifth and one in the seventh.

Ralph Mann, playing his first game for the Middles, relieved Anderson in right field in the fifth and cracked out a homer to deep center, driving Matheson across the plate ahead of him, on his first effort with the stick. He made a beautiful single the next time up, scoring Matheson again.
