

YALE MATMEN VICTORS

Defeat Penn, 27-3, Winning Seven of the Eight Matches

NEW HAVEN, Conn., Jan. 28.—

Yale scored a 27-to-3 wrestling victory over Penn today, winning seven of the eight events, four by referee's decisions and three by falls.

The meet was featured by the appearance of Captain Bob Allman of Penn, the first blind wrestler to compete at Yale. He was outpointed by Mallon in the 121-pound class. Late in the bout there was a delay while Allman's elbow was bandaged, following a slight injury.

Captain Waldo Bird of Yale scored a victory over McKee in a stubbornly contested 136-pound class match.

Norman Bond's 128-pound victory over Ely was clean-cut. It was the only Penn success.

Jim Latson, Yale, pinned Don Eagan to the mat in 7:24 for the first fall. Jack Hauer later threw George Stickney. Jim Pickett floored Wolfe for the third fall.
