NEW HAVEN, Conn., May 6.-Pennsylvania overcame Yale both games of a baseball doubleheader in the Eastern Intercollegiate League today, 5-1 and 3-2. The results dashed Yale's championship hopes and raised Pennsylvania's chances of a high final rating.

Both contests were decided by scintillating pitching, Anthony Caputo turning Yale back with five singles in the first game of seven innings and Lyn Fawley holding it to three in the ten innings they needed to decide the second contest, which had been planned also for seven chapters.

Al Stevens of Yale held Penn to six safeties in the second encounter, which was decided by a superbly executed squeeze play with one out in the tenth. In this manoeuvre Rafetto, after walking, was forced at second by McDonald, who stole the base. McDonald then took third on a passed ball and scored when Trexler bunted to Stevens, who got the ball to the plate too late to head off the flying McDonald. The box scores:
