

PENN BEATS NO. CAROLINA

Baseball Team Victor by 9-8 in Final Game of Tour

CHAPEL HILL, N. C., March 26 (AP)—The University of Pennsylvania baseball team concluded its six-day invasion of North Carolina today by racking up its first victory with a 9-8 decision over the University of North Carolina. The contest was called at 5:45 P. M., the time agreed upon, with the game in the eighth inning, to allow the Quakers to catch a train home.

The end of hostilities came at a rather timely moment for the visitors. After Penn had been retired in order in the eighth, Radman, first up for the Tarheels, reached first on an error and shortstop Matty Topkins walked to put runners on first and second with none away.
