

PRINCETON VICTOR OVER RUTGERS, 4-1

Carmichael and Perina Hold Scarlet to 5 Safeties in Game at New Brunswick

NEW BRUNSWICK, April 10—Dan Carmichael and Anson Perina limited Rutgers to five hits today as the Princeton baseball team scored its third victory of the campaign, conquering the Scarlet, 4 to 1, on Stadium Field before 500 fans. It was Rutgers's first loss in three starts.

The Tigers got to Ollie Compton for a single run in the fifth and knocked the Rutgers hurler from the mound in the sixth with a two-run drive. Hal Schank counted the Scarlet's only tally in the sixth, scoring on Angie Triandifilou's two-bagger.
