## WEATHER DISRUPTS COLLEGE SCHEDULE

## Sports Program Is. Hit Hard-N. Y. U.-Columbia Baseball Game Is Canceled

Cold weather and wet or snowcovered grounds throughout the East resulted in the postponement or outright cancellation of all but a few of the outdoor college athletic

events scheduled for yesterday.

All the local college baseball games, including such features as the forty-fifth New York University-Columbia meeting at Ohio Field, Manhattan-St. John's at Manhattan Field and Rutgers-Fordham at Fordham Field, were called off.

Immediate efforts to set an acceptable new date for the N. Y. U.-Columbia contest were unavailing, so it is likely that it will be canceled. Manhattan and St. John's will try again on a date as yet undecided. Fordham's game was can-

celed.

Princeton's scheduled Eastern League meeting with Cornell at Princeton was postponed, being rebooked as part of a double-header at Ithaca next Saturday. Army-Penn at West Point and Seton Hall-C. C. N. Y. at South Orange, N. J., were among the other postponements.

The number of other events, such as lacrosse, tennis, track and Rugby, similarly affected by the unseasonable weather, was almost as large. Naturally, most of the high and prep school sports events this area were wiped off the cal-

endar, too.
