PHILADELPHIA, May 1—Pennsylvania hit timely and took advantage of Lafayette's seven misplays to win from the Leopards today, 7—6. It was the first setback of the season for the visitors.

Glen Young, star southpaw, who had pitched eighteen scoreless innings, yielded nine hits, three of them coming in the third when the Red and Blue scored four runs, aided by four errors. Leo Kahn relieved Fawley in the eighth when the Leopards rallied with three runs. Arnold Beinstein led the Quaker attack with three hits.
