PHILADELPHIA, April 1— Pennsylvania and West Chester battled eleven innings to a 2-2 tie in the opening game for both teams on River Field today.

Dick Wisneski held the Red and Blue to one hit, a homer by Walt Wiesmiller, with Captain George Hain on base in the seventh. Wisneski struck out nine men and retired in favor of Alan Freudenheim at the end of the ninth.

Both West Chester runs were made off Hugh Niklason in the fifth, Vince DeMagistris's two bagger providing the heavy punch. Dr. Walter Cariss of Penn, starting his twenty-second coaching year, used six pitchers.
