

FORDHAM UPSETS

VILLANOVA, 52-44

Ends Rival's Streak at Eight

—Penn Sets Mark in 96-61

Victory Over Yale Five

PHILADELPHIA, Jan. 6 (AP)—Fordham's Rams sent Villanova's eighth ranking collegiate basketball team in the nation reeling from the ranks of the unbeaten tonight with an impressive 52-to-44 triumph at the Palestra. Penn walloped Yale, 96 to 61, in the first game of a double-header to record its second Eastern intercollegiate success in as many starts.

The victory was Fordham's seventh in ten games and ended the Villanova streak at nine straight. Penn, in beating Yale for the second time this season, gunned to its all-time E. I. L. score total.

Fordham opened with an 8-point sortie, but Villanova managed to go ahead, 13—12. The Rams quickly moved in front again and after a 22-22 tie, held the lead the remainder of the contest.

Villanova was blanked during the last five minutes of play, and could tally only a single point in the last six and one half minutes. In the battle of opposing centers, Fordham's Bill Carlson outscored Villanova's Tom Brennan, 17-14. Both were high for their respective teams.

Fordham hit on twenty-three of seventy-seven shots from the floor, while Villanova's field record showed seventeen for sixty-eight.

The old high for Penn was 95 points, set last February in the Boston Garden against Harvard. Better than .500 shooting on the part of the Quakers prevented the Elis from revenging an earlier 52—47 setback.

The winners hit on 38 of 75 shots from the floor. The Bulldogs made only 23 of 87.

Penn took the lead at the start and never trailed. The Quakers held bulges of 22—12 at the ten-minute mark, 49—28 at the intermission and 75—46 midway through the second half.

It was Penn's eighth victory in eleven starts and second in the League. Yale now stands 5—7.

Yale's Ed McHugh topped the scorers with 17 points. Ernie Beck and Tom Davis collected 15 apiece for the Quakers.
