CAMBRIDGE, Mass., Jan. 9—

The University of Pennsylvania kept the lead in the Eastern Basketball League tonight by defeating Harvard, 61—47.

The Pennsylvanians never trailed after the first two minutes, as they won their fourth game in a row and raised their league record to three victories without defeat. They now have nine triumphs and three losses. Harvard has lost nine and won three.

Ernie Beck led Penn with 21 points. Jim Fabler and Ed Smith paced Harvard with 13 apiece.

Harvard led by 3—0 after the first two minutes, but then Dick Dougherty and Beck found the range and Penn took a 31-17 lead at half-time.

BOSTON, Jan. 9 (AP)—Paced by Percy Johnson and Frank Lia, the Hofstra quintet from Hempstead, L. I., led all the way to defeat Bates, 57—46, tonight at the Arena.

Johnson scored 15 points and Lia 12 for the Long Islanders, who had a 27-24 margin at half-time. When they pulled into a 13-point lead during the second half, they called upon their spares.

Bates' top scorer was Bob Carpenter, with 12 points. Hofstra converted twenty-two of its seventy-five tries from the floor and made good with thirteen of its twenty-four free shots.

In the second game of the double-header, Boston College defeated Providence by 84—54.
