PHILADELPHIA, Jan. 27 (AP)—
Pennsylvania, sparked by Sopho-
more Ernie Beck's 36 points, turned
back Dartmouth, 81-67, tonight
on the Palestra basketball court
before 2,980 fans.

In leading Penn to its fourth
Eastern Intercollegiate League
victory against one defeat, Beck
tallied the most points ever scored
by a Penn player.

The Quakers led throughout the
contest, holding spreads of 25-11
at the ten-minute mark, 42-30 at
the intermission, and 59-50 mid-
way in the second half.

Penn hit on 34 of 79 shots from
the floor with Beck the individual
standout, connecting on 16 of 24.

Beck's 16 field goals snapped the
floor standard of 15, set by former
Villanova star Paul Arizin.

Paced by Larry Hennessey's 37
points, once-beaten Villanova beat
Boston College, 98-67, in the sec-
ond game. Villanova's winning
total wiped out the one-team rec-
ord of 96 points set by Penn
against Yale on Jan. 6.

Indiana Takes Sixth in Row

BLOOMINGTON, Ind., Jan. 27
(AP)—Indiana's Big Ten Conference
basketball leaders went along to-
night with a Minnesota team that
wanted a deliberate game and won
by the surprisingly low score of
32-26.

It was the sixth straight league
victory for Indiana, ranked No. 5
nationally in The Associated Press
weekly poll.

Both teams were virtually mo-
tionless for a six-minute period in
the second half. Indiana had the
ball and a 10-point lead and waited
for Minnesota to come after it.
Minnesota wouldn't.

A crowd of more than 10,000,
perfectly willing for Indiana to
stall with its healthy lead, counted
off the passing seconds in unison.

COLUMBUS, Ohio, Jan. 27 (AP)
—Defending champion Ohio State
won its first Western Conference
basketball game in six starts by
downing Michigan State, 58-49,
before 3,744 fans in the Fair-
grounds Coliseum. Michigan State
now has a 2-4 Big Ten record.

Northwestern Beats Purdue

EVANSTON, Ill., Jan. 27 (UP)—
Northwestern set a new scoring
record tonight in defeating Purdue,
97 to 79, before 3,500 fans in a
Western Conference basketball
game.

A tip-in by Ray Ragelis with
seven minutes left to play broke
Northwestern's single-game scor-
ing record of 81 points.
