

Beck Stars for Quakers

ANNAPOLIS, Md., Feb. 14—Sophomore Ernie Beck threw in 26 points to lead Penn to a 67—63 basketball victory over Navy today. The star center scored five points in the final 35 seconds to stave off the Middies' last bid in a game that saw the lead change hands seven times.

Bill Wilson, Navy's center, took the scoring honors with 28 points.

A crowd of 2,500 watched the Quakers gain a 40-33 half-time lead, relinquish it three times in the last half, then come on strong in the closing seconds to notch their fourteenth triumph of the season.
