CAMBRIDGE, Mass., Feb. 27—

Capt. Ed Smith poured in 31 points to equal the season's high for Harvard's indoor athletic building as the Crimson basketball team upset Princeton, 64—59, in an Eastern Intercollegiate League game tonight.

The 6-foot 5-inch center's brilliant performance matched another 31-point total compiled by Dick Lionette earlier in the season.

Operating against a variety of Tiger defensive patterns, Smith divided his output almost equally between the first and second halves. He caught fire midway through the opening period and spearheaded a Harvard surge which erased an early Princeton lead. The Crimson held a 35-27 advantage at intermission.

In the second half, Smith tossed in 15 points while helping to halt a Tiger counter-offensive by controlling both backboards as Harvard's pressing tactics forced the visitors to shoot from the outside. Chuck Devoe led Princeton's attempt to get back into contention by sinking 25 points, mostly in the final half.

With six minutes remaining, the count was knotted at 56—all. The Quakers then proceeded to break loose for 15 points while limiting the Irish to 4.

A 29-point performance by Penn's sophomore center, Ernie Beck, was the main factor in the Quaker victory. Beck counted 19 in the second half and brought his season total to 484.
