ITHACA, N. Y., May 8—Cornell defeated Pennsylvania, 14—5, in a wild game today.

The Ithacans took advantage of twelve bases on balls and six errors to score their third Eastern Intercollegiate Baseball League victory in four starts. It was Pennsylvania's fifth loss in six league contests.

Pennsylvania led, 5—3, when Cornell scored four runs in the sixth, with Roger Chadwick's triple driving in two runs.

Gene Sattler hit for the circuit in the third for Pennsylvania with Bell Deuber on base. Sam MacNeil of Cornell lost a home run in the first when he failed to touch third base.
