

# PENN ROUTS MIAMI ON COURT BY 89-64

## Beck's 23 Points Set Pace in Florida Game—Stetson Halts Yale Quintet, 64-52

MIAMI, Fla., Dec. 29 (AP) — A Pennsylvania basketball team hit with 52 per cent of its shots from the floor tonight to swamp the Miami Hurricanes, 89—64.

Despite the sensational accuracy of the Penn team, Miami stayed fairly close until midway in the third quarter, when Ernie Beck, the Quakers' flashy junior center, went on a scoring spree to wrap up the contest.

Beck, held in check in the first half, when he collected only five points, dropped seven field goals out of nine shots during the third period and added three free throws to break open the Miami defense. He played only briefly in the last quarter but topped the scorers with 23 points.
