PRINCETON, N. J., March 15—
Pennsylvania's Ernie Beck scored
23 points and the Quakers defeat-
ed Princeton's newly crowned
Eastern Basketball League cham-
pions, 63-60, tonight.

The lead changed hands nine
times. Tom Holt put Penn ahead
to stay at 3:15 of the final period
and though Princeton never gave
up, the Quakers' zone defense and
freeze at the end clinched the de-
cision.

For Penn the victory meant
more than just revenge for a 79-77
defeat earlier in the season at the
hands of the Tigers; it gave the
team second place in the final
league standings.

The Quakers finished the season
with a 9 and 3 league record and
a mark of 21 and 8 over all.

The Tigers, who go to Chicago
Friday to meet Duquesne in the
first round of the N. C. A. A. play-
offs, had clinched the title on
Wednesday by defeating Columbia.
Princeton concluded its regular
season with a 10 and 2 league
record and 16 and 9 over all.
