

PHILADELPHIA, May 7—An eight-run outburst in the eighth inning gained Cornell's baseball team a 14-7 victory over the University of Pennsylvania in an Eastern Intercollegiate League game today. The triumph enabled Cornell to tie Columbia for first place in the Southern Division of the Ivy loop.

Behind by 7-6, the Ithacans put together five singles and a two-run homer by Lee Morton to take their third league verdict in four decisions. The Quakers now stand 1-4 in league competition.

Shortstop Roger Chadwick collected four singles in five trips to lead the seventeen-hit Cornell attack. He also had five stolen bases. Jim Craig belted a second-inning home run for Cornell.
