

PHILADELPHIA, Jan. 3 (AP)—A hard-driving Penn basketball team, playing without the services of the nation's high-average scorer, Ernie Beck, staged a spirited rally and defeated the Pitt Panthers, 81—76, in overtime tonight at the Palestra.

In the second game Duquesne defeated Villanova, 68—61.

A flurry of one-handed set shots by Penn's Karl Hoagland enabled the Quakers to overcome Pitt's 14-8 lead and move to a 19-18 first-quarter margin.

The Panthers, taking advantage of Penn's lack of height, pulled in front in the second period on the shooting of Mickey Zernich. Dick Deitrick tallied a short jump shot as the buzzer sounded to give Pitt a three-point half-time bulge. Deitrick scored 19 points.

Two foul shots by John Lavin sent Penn to within 3 points in the last three minutes of play. Dick Heylmun then stole the ball and connected with a thirty-foot one-hander. Virostek hit with a foul shot to make the score 67—65, but Heylmun scored on another long one-hander in the final minute of regulation play to send the game into a five-minute overtime period.
