

PENN VICTOR, 77-49, TAKES IVY HONORS

Routs Harvard's Five as Beck Adds 27 Points, Gains Third Straight Scoring Title

CAMBRIDGE, Mass., March 9—Ernie Beck, Pennsylvania's all-America center, scored 27 points tonight to pace a 77-49 victory over Harvard as the Quakers gained their first Ivy League basketball title since 1945 and earned a berth in the N. C. A. A. tournament.

Harvard, resting in the cellar, never was in the game, as Penn led 20-10 after the first period and coasted home. The victory was the tenth in twelve Ivy games for the Quakers, who have an overall record of 22-4. Runner-up Columbia, defeated by Princeton tonight, finished with 8-4 mark.

Beck wound up his Eastern intercollegiate career by taking his third straight individual scoring title. Gus Broberg of Dartmouth, the only other player to capture the honors three years running, took the crown in 1939-41. Beck had 303 points to 276 for Columbia's Jack Molinas.

With Beck throwing in ten of thirty-one floor shots, Penn drew away to a 41-25 halftime margin tonight and at the end of three periods increased it to 56-33. Bart Leach scored 13 points and Dick Heylmun 11 for the winners.

Harry Sacks was the high scorer for Harvard with 16 markers.

The Ivy champions will play the winner of the Eastern Kentucky-Notre Dame game in Chicago Friday.
