

# DEROMA OF ARMY SUBDUES PENN, 7-0

Yields Only One Hit, Single  
in Ninth, and Strikes Out  
15 in League Opener

PHILADELPHIA, April 5—  
Jerry DeRoma, a 6-foot 2-inch,  
220-pound football fullback,  
struck out fifteen batters and  
allowed one hit in pitching  
Army to a 7-0 victory over  
Pennsylvania in the opening  
Eastern Intercollegiate League  
baseball game today on Murphy  
Field.

DeRoma had a no-hitter go-  
ing until Bill Kesack, who plays  
on the Quaker eleven, singled  
over shortstop with one out in  
the ninth inning. DeRoma  
walked four men, facing thirty-  
two batters.

Three runs were scored in  
the third inning for Army by  
Alex Grant, who singled; De-  
Roma, who doubled, and Butch  
Ordway, who walked. Penn  
made three errors, two of them  
overthrows by the catcher.
