

COLLEGE BASEBALL IS HIT HARD BY RAIN

Rain washed out many college baseball games scheduled yesterday in the metropolitan area and in other parts of the East.

Locally, the contests between Fordham and Hofstra at Jack Coffey Field, the Bronx, and New York University and Long Island University at Ohio Field were canceled. Also canceled was the Iona-St. Peter's game in New Rochelle.

The Metropolitan Collegiate Conference clash pairing St. John's and Wagner at Alley Pond Park, Queens Village, was postponed indefinitely, as were the Knickerbocker Conference tests between Hunter and the Long Island Aggies at Farmingdale and the United States Merchant Marine Academy-Queens College game at Kings Point, L. I.

Other games deferred were those between St. Francis and Adelphi at the Prospect Park Parade Grounds, Brooklyn, Hartwick and Upsala at East Orange, N. J., and Stevens Tech and Newark Engineering at Hoboken, N. J.

Also rained out were the Eastern Intercollegiate League contests between Columbia and Dartmouth at Hanover, N. H., Yale and Cornell at New Haven, Navy and Harvard at Annap-

olis, Md., and Pennsylvania and Brown at Philadelphia.

The clash between Princeton and Rutgers at Princeton was rescheduled for May 12.

The Army-Manhattan game at West Point and the Colgate-Syracuse contest at Hamilton, N. Y., were postponed indefinitely. The Penn State-West Virginia game at University Park, Pa., and the Lehigh-Lafayette test at Easton, Pa., were canceled.

Among events curtailed was the metropolitan intercollegiate track and field meet at Downing Stadium, Randalls Island. The championships, rescheduled for tomorrow at 4 P. M., were put off after the varsity and freshman broad-jump events were held.
