

NAVY TURNS BACK

PENN FIVE, 66-53

Johnson's 20 Points Help Middies Win—Rubincam Excels for Quakers

ANNAPOLIS, Md., Dec. 6—
Capt. Dick Johnson, a senior
from Austin, Tex., scored 20
points to lead Navy to a 66-53
victory over Pennsylvania in
the midshipmen's basketball
opener today.

Paul Rubincam topped the
Quakers with 19 points. Penn,
which has a 1-1 record now,
opened its season with a 63-55
victory over Rutgers.

The game was close for the
first ten minutes. Then Navy
got 9 points in a row midway
in the first half to turn a 16-13
deficit into a 22-16 lead. Dick
Brown, a 6-foot 3-inch sopho-
more from Silver Springs, Md.,
made 6 points in the spurt.

Navy, opening its thirteenth
season under Coach Ben Carne-
vale, a former New York Uni-
versity star, held a 32-23 lead at

the half. Sparked by the shooting of Rubincam, Penn cut its deficit to 38—33 early in the second half, but never seriously threatened again as Navy scored 14 of the next 19 points.

Bob Mlkvy, Penn's highly rated, 6-foot 4-inch sophomore star, failed to see action. The brother of the former Temple all-America, Bill Mlkvy, was sidelined by a leg injury.

Despite the 13-point loss, Penn nearly outshot the middies from the field. The Quakers made twenty-one of fifty-two shots for 40 per cent, compared to twenty-two of sixty-three and 36 per cent for Navy. However, the middies were hot at the foul line, making twenty-two of twenty-eight attempts.

Rubincam was the only Quaker who did well against the middies' zone defense. He scored consistently with set shots from the side and also registered with driving one-hand shots.

Allen Schwait, a forward, got 8 points for Penn.
