

Columbia Beats Penn Behind Pepe's Two-Hitter

PHILADELPHIA, April 8—Columbia defeated Pennsylvania, 4 to 3, behind the two-hit pitching of Frank Pepe, a left-hander, in the Eastern Intercollegiate League baseball opener for both teams today on Murphy Field. Pepe, who allowed two singles, struck out seven, ending the contest with two strike-outs.

Columbia scored twice in the fourth. Mike Esposito doubled to left, Don Savini walked and Dick Russano bunt singled. Mike Villano then singled to center, scoring Esposito and Savini.

In the sixth, Archie Robinson hit a homer for Columbia, scoring Villano.

Also in the sixth, Penn's Gordy Achilles singled in George Campbell, Chuck Klein scored on a wild pitch and Achilles tallied on Herky Rubincam's sacrifice.
