VILLANOVA, 72-70

**St. Bonaventure Snaps Late Tie for 11th in Row—
West Va. Bows, 97-93**

PHILADELPHIA, Feb. 17 (AP)—St. Bonaventure won its eleventh basketball game in a row by upsetting Villanova, 72—70, tonight on Bill Connery's driving lay-up with nine seconds left in the game.

In the second game of the double-header Penn upset La Salle, the Middle Atlantic Conference leader, 66—62.

The Bonnies now are 14—3. Villanova, losing its second straight, is 17—3 for the season.

In the last six minutes the lead changed hands twice and the game was tied twice. St. Bonaventure's Tom Stith, the leading scorer with 30 points, tied the score, 66—66, and Ron Martin put the Bonnies ahead with an outside shot.

Then after Villanova had tied, 70—70, Martin stole the ball and the Bonnies froze it until Connery made his basket.
