Harvard Beats Penn, 61—58

PHILADELPHIA, Feb. 19 (AP)—Two fouls by Ed Cuffe and one by Mike Donohue in the last fifteen seconds of play helped Harvard gain a 61-58 victory over the Penn five tonight at the Palestra.

In the second game of the double-header, St. Joseph's beat its cross-state rival, St. Francis of Loretto, Pa., 78—69.

Harvard held a 26-21 margin at half-time but was tied nine times in the second half before capturing its fifth straight Ivy League victory.
