Penn Five Checks Dartmouth, 68 to 64

PHILADELPHIA, Feb. 20— The Penn quintet survived two bad scoring lapses tonight and defeated Dartmouth, the Ivy League leader, 68—64, at the Palestra tonight.

As a result of its loss, Dartmouth dropped into a first-place tie with Princeton in the Ivy League.

In the second game of the double-header, Temple defeated La Salle, 77—53.

Penn went the last five and a half minutes of the opener without a field goal but hit on six straight free throws in the last minute and a half to maintain its winning margin.

Bob Mlkvy got 22 points for

the victors. Chuck Kaufman led Dartmouth with 17. The Indians trailed, 43—32, at half-time and got back into the contest when their all-court press rattled Penn. The Quakers went without a point for five minutes and later were scoreless for three minutes.

But the closest Dartmouth got was 53—52. Then a technical foul called against the Dartmouth coach, Doggie Julian, allowed Penn to rack up a foul shot and a field goal when it kept possession.

Dartmouth has an over-all record of eleven victories and eight defeats. It has won seven and lost three in Ivy League competition. Penn has a 5-5 mark in league play and is 11—10 for the season.
