

# TWO PENN HOMERS TOP COLUMBIA, 3-1

Purdy, in Relief, Preserves  
—Victory in Ninth—Army  
Sinks Dartmouth, 8-1

Larry Purdy, a right-hander, checked a ninth-inning threat by Columbia yesterday and preserved a 3-1 victory for Pennsylvania in an Eastern Intercollegiate League game at Baker Field.

Purdy entered in relief for Grover Powell, a left-hander who had struck out seventeen men before a single by Mike Villano and three walks produced the Lions' run.

Bob Koehler, the Columbia starter, served a home run to Bob Zajac in the first inning. Zajac's single in the third scored another run.

The final Quaker run came in the seventh on Ed Shaw's drive over the center-field screen.
