League basketball race with a
2-0 won-lost mark. Penn is 0-1.

The Ithacans took the lead
early in the first half and never
were headed.

Cornell's Rick Clark, a 6-foot
6-inch reserve center, started his
first game and held Penn's scor-
ing ace, Bob Mlkvy, scoreless
from the floor.

Mlkvy, an all-Ivy center last
year, netted only five free
throws while missing all eleven
floor shots he took.

John Petry led the Big Red
with 18 points.
