

Free Throws Help Elis

NEW HAVEN, Conn., Feb. 10
—Yale, capitalizing on its foul-line accuracy, posted a 60-51 Ivy League basketball victory over Pennsylvania tonight.

The Elis, who sank only seven field goals in each half, made thirty-two of thirty-six free throws. They registered twenty-six of twenty-eight in the second half.

Penn also tallied seven field goals in the first half, which ended with the Elis ahead, 20—18.

Although the visitors were able to tie the score five times, they never led.

Mark Landrum of Yale, with 20 points, including 12 from the foul line, led all scorers.

Yale now has a 4-2-Ivy record and is 8—8 over-all. Penn, suffering its eighth loss in fifteen games for the season has a 2-4 Ivy mark.
