3-RUN NAVY DRIVE TOPPLES PENN, 5-2

Foyle Connects in Ninth-Army Triumphs, 18-0, Over Swarthmore

PHILADELPHIA, April 8—A ninth-inning homer by Bob Foyle with two men on base broke a 2-2 tie and earned Navy a 5-2 victory over Pennsylvania today in the opening game of the Eastern Intercollegiate Baseball League.

Foyle's drive came with two out. It scored Harvey Cybul and Ron Reilhel. The homer was made off Ralph McIntyre, who had relieved Grover Powell. Powell had held Navy to four hits for the first eight innings. Chuck Davis, a left-handed pitcher, struck out nine Penn batters and held the Quakers to six hits. The victory was Navy's fifth in five games. Penn suffered its first loss in four games.

Navy scored two runs in the first inning on two errors and two walks. Penn tied the score in the eighth when Dave Mc-Kinley tripled home Mike Tate and then scored on a fielder's

choice.
