

PENN WRESTLERS CHECK COLUMBIA

Lions' Ivy League Victory Streak Is Ended at 9

Pennsylvania's varsity wrestling team sent Columbia to its first Ivy League defeat of the season yesterday, beating the Lions, 25-8, at University Hall.

The setback ended Columbia's winning streak against Ivy foes at nine and pushed the defending champion Lions out of a tie for the league lead with Cornell.

Penn forfeited the 123-pound match and then went on to take seven straight decisions before Bob Asack of Columbia defeated Dennis Woolley in the heavyweight match, 7-6.

The Quakers also scored once on a forfeit, when Columbia withdrew its entrant in the 191-pound match.

After the Penn forfeit, Columbia's 123-pound standout, Jim Balquist, wrestled Bill Lukens of Penn at 130 pounds and lost a 13-2 decision.

Chris Olmstead, a Penn sophomore, wrestling his first varsity match, then defeated Columbia's Jon Anfanger at 137 pounds, 2-1, with a riding-time advantage.

Penn won once on a fall. Ron Black pinned Norm Nelson of Columbia at 5:48 of the 167-pound after a five-minute delay for an injury to Black.

The victory was Penn's third in four meets this season. The Quakers are 1-1 in the Ivy League. Columbia had had two Ivy victories.

Columbia's dual-meet record is four victories and two defeats.
