EXTENDED TO 23

Campbell Paces Princeton on 26 Points—Dartmouth Downs Boston U., 64-53

PRINCETON, N. J., Jan. 27 —Princeton's fast break and outside shooting beat Penn, 93—81, in basketball tonight before 2,700.

Pete Campbell led the Tigers with 26 points. Campbell and Art Hyland engineered the fast break. Hyland added 19 points.

The Tigers extended their Ivy League victory streak at home to twenty-three. Princeton has not lost an Ivy contest at home since Rebruary of 1958.

Princeton outscored Penn, 18—16, in the final six minutes of the first half for a 41—29 advantage. The surge continued in the second half.
