NEW HAVEN, March 2 —

Yale scored a 81-66 victory over Dartmouth tonight and won its first Ivy League basketball crown in five years.

The triumph was the eighth straight for the Elis and the twelfth in their last thirteen starts.

Yale's Ivy League won-lost record is now 12-1. Penn, which beat Cornell last night, has a 10-3 mark. The teams have one game remaining.

Capt. Bill Madden led Yale with 19 points. His first 2 points, coming on a field goal after a minute and a half of play, made him the sixth performer in Yale history to total 1,000 points in a varsity basketball career.

After the first seven minutes, the score was tied at 12-12. Then Steve Goulding, who tallied 17 points, put Yale ahead to stay with a field goal.

Steve Spahn, a junior guard and the Ivy League's leading scorer, gave a fine exhibition of foul shooting in the first half to keep the visitors close. He connected on all fourteen of his free-throw attempts and added three baskets for a 20-point output. Spahn finished the game with 25 points.

The Ivy championship is the second for coach Joe Vancisin at Yale. His first team there, in 1956-57, was the last Eli squad to win the crown.

By winning the title, Yale qualified for a berth in the Eastern regionals of the National Collegiate tournament on March 12 at Philadelphia.

Pete Campbell moved to within 11 points of the Ivy League career scoring record tonight as Princeton's basketball team routed Columbia, 82-47.

The Tiger senior scored 29 points, bringing his three-year total to 848. Chet Forte scored 859 in a career at Columbia that ended in 1957. Campbell thus needs 12 points in his final Ivy League game here tomorrow against Cornell to break Forte's record.
