PHILADELPHIA, March 3 (AP) — Pennsylvania wrapped up second place in the Ivy League with a 73-47 basketball victory over last-place Columbia before a capacity crowd of 9,200 at the Palestra tonight.

Villanova defeated St. Joseph's, 66—59, in the second game of the double-header.

The victory for the Quakers was their thirteenth in a row in the league at home in two seasons. Penn finished with an 11-3 won-lost mark in Ivy competition, right behind Yale. The Quakers now are 17—8 over all.

Jon Wideman, with 16 points, and Sid Amira, with 14, led Penn. From an 8-6 lead, Penn scored 10 points in succession and never trailed in the game.
