## WILDCATS SCORE IN OWN TOURNEY

### Bradley of Princeton Sets 3 Records as Tigers Take Consolation Game, 90-87

LEXINGTON, Ky., Dec. 21 (AP) — Kentucky's outside shooting in the first half ruined Wake Forest's zone defense tonight as the Wildcats defeated the Deacons, 98-75, in the final game of the University of Kentucky invitation basketball tournament.

Bill Bradley set three tournament records in leading Princeton to a 90-87 overtime victory over Wisconsin in the third-place game.

Cotton Nash led Kentucky with 28 points on 11 field goals and 6 free throws. Kentucky made 11 of its first 14 field goal attempts and was never headed.

Bradley scored 47 points on 18 field goals—both new records—and his two-game total of 77 points was a mark, too.

Bradley scored 6 of Princeton's 11 points during the overtime. His one-game and two-game scoring records surpassed marks set by Jerry West of West Virginia in 1959. His field goal record erased one set by Larry Pursiful of Kentucky two years ago.
