

Kentucky Five Triumphs, 86-64; Princeton Wins and Penn Loses

Duke Ousts Auburn

NEW ORLEANS, Dec. 30 (AP)—Undefeated Kentucky overcame Loyola of New Orleans in the second half tonight and won the opening game of the Sugar Bowl basketball tournament, 86—64. It was the Wildcats' second-lowest point production of the season.

In the second game Duke ousted the 1962 winner, Auburn, 84—67, and will meet Kentucky tomorrow afternoon for the championship.

Loyola, led by Al Kennedy, trailed by only 4 points at the half. However, the Wildcats penetrated Loyola in the second half and, helped by Cotton Nash and Ted Deeken, steadily increased their lead.

Nash led Kentucky with 28 points. Kennedy had 23 for Loyola. Deeken scored 16. The victory was Kentucky's ninth of the season. Loyola, which has won five of seven games, held the Wildcats to their lowest scoring output since the season opener, when Kentucky beat the University of Virginia, 75—61.

Davidson Gains Final

CHARLOTTE, N. C., Dec. 30 (UPI)—Bill Bradley scored 46 points to lead Princeton to an 84—71 upset victory over Texas and Davidson routed Pennsylvania, 90—73, tonight in the Charlotte invitation basketball tournament. Davidson will meet Princeton tomorrow night for the championship.

Bradley came within a point of tying the court one-game record, thrilling 11,666 fans with his deft shooting.

The Longhorns maintained a slight advantage during the early part of the first half. But their 4-point lead disappeared as Bradley caught fire and sank 17 points toward the end of the half to give the Tigers a 42—40 intermission lead.

In the early stages of the second half, the teams were tied on six occasions. But a driving layup by Bradley with slightly less than 10 minutes remaining sent the Princeton into the lead to stay at 56—55.

Mike Humphrey was high for Texas with 14. In the opening game, the Wildcats jumped to a 3—0 lead and maintained the advantage throughout the game.
