

Penn Hands Columbia 67-58 Defeat and Takes Share of Ivy League Lead

TWO SOPHOMORES TOUCH OFF RALLY

Pennsylvania remained undefeated in Ivy League basketball competition by defeating Columbia, 67-58 last night at University Hall gymnasium. Jeff Neuman, a sophomore from Altoona, Pa., sparked a surge in the final three minutes that helped the Quakers break a 58-all tie.

Neuman scored 6 of Penn's last 10 points, and his layup on a fast-break feed from Ray Carazo put Penn in front to stay, 60-58, with 2:31 remaining.

The victory was the third for the Quakers in the Ivy League and kept them tied for first place with Princeton.

Stan Pawlak, another Penn sophomore, paced his team with 25 points. He led an early drive that helped the Red and Blue gain a 9-point bulge early in the first half.

Neil Farber of Columbia, a junior from Yonkers, was the game's top scorer with 26 points. He teamed with Stan Felsing in a drive that cut Penn's lead to a point midway in the second half. Columbia finally gained a 46-45 lead, when Ken Benoit hit a long jumper at 10:10.

The lead changed hands four times and the score was tied on three occasions before Penn took control on Neuman's late basket.
