

Penn Thwarts Harvard

CAMBRIDGE, Mass., Feb. 8 (AP)—Penn stemmed a late Harvard rally tonight and posted a 75-67 decision that kept the Tigers tied for first place.

The Crimson had pulled to one point behind, 68—67, on Leo Scully's 3-point play, but Stan Pawlak sank a free throw, Joe Andrews tapped in a rebound for his first field goal, and Penn added 3 more points for the triumph.

Ray Carazo led the victors with 20 points, while Merl McClung came up with 29 for Harvard.
