**Penn Wins, 73 to 62**

PHILADELPHIA, Feb. 28 (AP)—Stan Pawlak and Jeff Neuman of Penn scored 29 points between them tonight in a 73-62 basketball victory over Cornell that kept the Quakers in the race for the Ivy League championship.

Penn raised its league won-lost record to 9-3 as Pawlak scored 20 points and Neuman 19.

Cornell, trailing by 19-8, pulled to within 33-32 at half-time. Early in the second half, it pushed ahead 44-40.

Penn regained the lead at 46-45 with 12:37 remaining and held on the rest of the way.

La Salle defeated Utah State 90-50, in the second game of the double-header.
