

Penn Tops Columbia, 67-56

PHILADELPHIA, Feb. 29—

Pennsylvania remained in contention for the Ivy League championship by scoring a 67-56 victory over Columbia in the opening game of a double-header before 9,000 fans tonight.

Villanova defeated Temple, 67-60, in the second game of the double-header.

Penn trailed by 5 points at the half, but rallied after halting the Lions with a zone defense in the final 11 minutes.

Columbia led, 47-45, with 11:20 left when the Quakers began a drive that put them in front by 6 points before the Lions scored again.
