

CAMBRIDGE, Mass., Feb. 4 —Pennsylvania routed Worcester Polytechnic Institute, 7—1, and Connecticut stopped Massachusetts Institute of Technology, 8—4, in the M.I.T. hockey round-robin tonight.

W.P.I. checked Penn in the first period until Steve Connett scored at 3:45. But a wild second period, which included 14 penalties and five Penn goals proved to be the difference. John McKay quickly tallied twice, at 15:15 and 15:10. John Dewing and Buzz Raborn followed with goals at 12:47 and 11:16. Dewing scored again at 2:27.

W.P.I.'s lone goal also came in the second period, when Steve Boraks scored at 9:13. Bill Chick added Penn's seventh goal at 9:16 of the last stanza.

M.I.T., led by Henry Newell's two goals, held Connecticut to a 3-3 tie going into the last period. But Bob Knudsen and Tom Richardson of Connecticut combined for five goals to turn the contest into a runaway.
