

PAWLAK, NEUMAN SCORE 46 POINTS

Help 3d-Place Quakers Stay in Race for Ivy Crown— Zone Stymies Big Red

PHILADELPHIA, Feb. 26 (AP)—Penn, clinging to its slim chance to tie for the Ivy League basketball championship, upset Cornell by 79—70 tonight. Stan Pawlak and Jeff Neuman scored 46 points between them.

St. Joseph's defeated La Salle 93—85, in the second game of the double-header at the Palestra. The victory was St. Joseph's 14th straight and gave it a 24-1 won-lost record.

Penn's victory gave the Quakers a 9-3 won-lost record in the Ivy League behind Princeton and Cornell.

Pawlak and Neuman, outracing the zone-stymied Big Red, scored 26 and 20 points, respectively.
