

Columbia Beats Harvard, 75-73; Princeton Is Victor Over Brown

CAMBRIDGE, Mass., Jan. 8 (AP) — Dave Newmark, a 7-foot sophomore center, scored 13 points in a 10-minute span in the second half tonight in sparking Columbia to a 75-73 Ivy League basketball victory over Harvard.

Newark captured scoring honors with 21 points as he paced the Lions to their third straight league triumph and 10th in 12 starts against all competition.

Columbia led, 39-34, at half the intermission to go in front the intermission to go in front 44-43. Joel Hoffman put Columbia back into the lead and Newark then got hot, increasing the advantage to 70-60 with three minutes to play.

The Crimson rallied again but time ran out and they suffered their second Ivy loss. Harvard's over-all record is 4-8.

Keith Sedlacek and Gene Dressler led Harvard scorers with 18 points each.

Cornell Triumphs by 59-57

HANOVER, N. H., Jan. 8 (AP) — A sophomore guard, Greg Morris, scored 9 points in overtime tonight in leading Cornell to a 59-57 Ivy League basketball victory over Dartmouth.

Morris took charge after Dartmouth forced the game into overtime on Joel Colgan's 20-foot shot with 65 seconds remaining.

Morris broke the 48-48 deadlock and went on to score two field goals and five free throws. He finished with 16 points.

With both teams playing control ball, Cornell moved to a 31-25 half-time lead. Dartmouth managed to tie the game by holding the visitors to 17 points in the second half.

Morris was Cornell's top scorer as the Big Red increased its won-lost record to 7-5, including 3-1 in Ivy competition.

Colgan scored 21 points as Dartmouth suffered its second straight Ivy loss and seventh in nine games over all.

PROVIDENCE, R. I., Jan. 8 (AP) — Princeton outscored Brown, 18-1, in the first eight minutes of the second half tonight and went on to post a 60-46 basketball victory in an Ivy League game.

Brown was on top, 26-21, at the half in a tightly fought defensive battle. Then Princeton opened the second half with its scoring spurt and never was overtaken.

A 6-foot-6 Princeton forward, Ed Hummer, led the scoring for both teams with 13 points. Don Rodenbach of Princeton had 12.

Princeton's play under the backboards was the decisive factor in the game. Led by Robbie Brown, who hauled in 14 rebounds, Princeton outrebounded the losers, 42-28.

Princeton has a 9-2 won-lost record for the season, Brown is 5-9.

NEW HAVEN, Jan. 8—Pennsylvania put on an impressive second-half performance tonight to score a decisive 84-56 Ivy League basketball victory over Yale.

Leading by only a point, 31-30, at half-time, the visitors took advantage of a Yale scoring lapse to break open the game. Jeff Neuman and Chuck Fitzgerald led a Pennsylvania spurt that widened the lead from 42-39 to 55-39 early in the second half.

Neuman was the game's leading scorer with 26 points.

Pennsylvania has a 2-0 won-lost record in the Ivy League and is 8-2 over all. Yale now stands at 1-3 in Ivy play and is 4-7 over all.
