PHILADELPHIA, Feb. 19 (UPI)—Pennsylvania strengthened its grip on first place in the Ivy League tonight with an 84-66 victory over Cornell in the opener of a basketball double-header at the Palestra.

In the second game, St. Joseph's defeated Creighton, 99-90.

Stan Pawlak and Jeff Neuman paced Penn's attack with 24 points each. The Quakers took an early lead, but Cornell came back to tie at 20-20. Penn then ran off 7 points in a row to gain a 27-20 edge, which was increased to 45-37 at the half.

Midway through the second half, the Quakers led, 67-52. Neuman and Pawlak then went on a spree that pushed the Big Red out of contention.

Steve Cram's 23 points led the Cornell scoring. The victory gave Penn a 10-1 won-lost record in the Ivy League.

Yale Trips Harvard, 76-67

NEW HAVEN, Feb. 19—Two 3-point plays by Frank Wisniewski keyed Yale to a 76-67 Ivy League basketball victory over Harvard here tonight.

After the Elis had protected a 9-point half-time lead throughout most of the second half, Harvard used a full-court press to cut the Yale advantage to 66-63 with less than three minutes remaining. Wisniewski's pair of 3-point plays followed to raise the margin to 72-63.

The victory gave Yale sole possession of fifth place in the Ivy standings. The Elis won-lost record is now 4-7 in the league and 7-11 over-all, while Harvard is 3-8 in Ivy play and 7-14 over-all.
